Warm Weather Hazards

- ✓ Animal toxins—toads, insects, spiders, snakes, and scorpions;
- ✓ Blue-green algae in ponds;

- ✓ Citronella candles;
- ✓ Cocoa mulch;
- ✓ Compost pile fertilizers;
- ✓ Flea products;
- ✓ Outdoor plants and plant bulbs;
- ✓ Swimming-pool treatment supplies;
- ✓ Fly baits containing methomyl; and
- ✓ Slug and snail baits containing metaldehyde.

Meet a Club Member -----

Continuing with my series of interviews of the club's officers and directors, this month my interview is of:

Karen Salvage, Director

Karen was born and raised in Brooklyn, New York. In 1972, she moved to Florida. Professionally, Karen is a teacher and has just finished her 31st year of teaching. Currently, Karen teaches basic computer (software) at Dillard High School in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, and has taught there since the beginning of the 1980-1981 school year. Karen has eight more years until she can retire.

Karen first started out in the world of dogs in the obedience realm with a Labrador/shepherd mix, two rescued miniature poodles, and an apricot standard poodle. When asked what first attracted her to shelties, her response was that she wanted to know why her dogs did not come when they were called. Karen's vet had a highly respected trainer (Candace Hammack) teaching classes at night. Karen relates that the first night of class the trainer brought out this "little black, white, and brown dog" (which Karen later learned was a tri-color sheltie), and the two of them performed an obedience pattern. To say the least, when the trainer asked who wanted to do what they just did, Karen's hand shot up in the air. She was hooked. In time, Karen learned that this trainer's dog, "Boffy," was ranked anywhere from one to ten nationally in obedience for many years. Karen mentions how she loved watching "Boffy" in the ring.

After that, Karen wanted and ultimately in 1993 acquired her first sheltie, "Shelby," a/k/a WarmWinds Push and Pull, CD, from Dori Gibbs of WarmWinds Shetland Sheepdogs (now Dori Stadler of Touchtone Shetland Sheepdogs). "Shelby" was sired by CH Kylene Cindahope Town Cryer, ROM.

Karen currently owns five grown shelties, along with a litter of puppies. The call names and registered names of her current shelties are:

As you can see from the above list, Karen has obtained several titles with her shelties. In addition to "Shelby's" CD, she is equally proud of "Taffy's" conformation championship. "Taffy" came from a litter of seven girls, wherein three of the siblings finished their American conformation championships and one finished her Canadian championship. Karen remembers vividly "Taffy's" first Best of Breed win at our specialty when "Taffy" was four years old. At that show, there were five other champions with a total entry of 85 dogs. Since then, she has finished "Teddybear's" conformation championship. Recently though, Karen is proud to have bred "Kodybear" (see photo) and proud that she has been able to put "Kodybear's" first six points on him by herself.



Karen's mentor is Dori Stadler of Touchtone Shelties. Dori started Karen and has kept her going. They are still good friends and talk "dogs" often. When asked what words of wisdom she received from her mentor that have stuck with her the most, her response was: "Be open minded, not kennel blind. Don't follow the leader. Keep studying and listening and learning." In addition to Dori, Karen feels that there are many other people who she has learned from and to whom she still asks questions. She feels that our club has had some fantastic seminars in the past few years which have allowed her to continue to learn and to grow.

She feels that she has finally found the line that melds with her line and she hopes to continue improving her line closer to the AKC standard. She wants to produce structurally correct, fun-loving companion, conformation, and performance dogs.

In 1995, Karen became a club member of the Shetland Sheepdog Club of Southeast Florida, Inc. She has previously held the positions of board member, president, and vice-president. She is currently a board member once again. Karen has been a member of the American Shetland Sheepdog Association since 2000.

What would Karen like to see the club accomplish this year? She says that she would like to see two very successful specialties. In addition, she mentions that: "It would be nice if more club members would become more involved with activities. I hope everyone tries to encourage new sheltie people to join and participate in club activities."

When asked about her current and future goals, Karen's response was: "To continue having fun." And then she added: "I hope to be involved in this wonderful sheltie world for a long time to come." I am sure we can all agree that we would like to "continue having fun" right along with Karen!

SSCSEF MINUTES

September 11, 2007
